Local Lawyers Admitted to Practice before the U.S. Supreme Court

The honor of being admitted to practice before the highest court in the land has practical as well as symbolic implications for Ellis, Ged & Bodden, P.A. Mr. Ged, Ms. Ellis and Mrs. Corcione may now directly represent the interests of the firm and its clients by appealing verdicts and presenting arguments before the Court. The Supreme Court of the United States was created by authority of the Judiciary Act of 1789; it was the first bill introduced in the United States Senate which signifies the importance our fledgling nation placed on establishing a Federal Judiciary. To qualify for admission to the bar of the U.S. Supreme Court, an applicant must have been admitted to practice in the highest court of a State, Commonwealth, Territory or Possession, or the District of Columbia for a period of at least three years immediately before the date of application; must not have been the subject of any adverse disciplinary action pronounced or in effect during that three-year period; and must appear to the Court to be of good moral and professional character.

Mr. Ged was admitted to the Florida Bar in 1992. His work in severe personal injury and wrongful death cases has earned him a reputation as one of the region's most compassionate and dedicated lawyers. Ms. Ellis is admitted to practice law in both Florida and Massachusetts. She specializes in personal injury and product liability, representing numerous clients in class action and mass tort cases involving manufacturer and product recalls/defects. Mrs. Corcione is admitted to the Florida Bar.
